III. The Free Library of Philadelphia

A. Summer Reading 2008

Children, preschool through 6th grade, can sign up at any local library and start a reading folder. They earn stickers and prizes weekly by reading Library books, using other Library materials, or by participating in Library activities. Teens, going into grades 7 through 12, can complete a raffle entry form each time they read a book or magazine, watch a Library video, surf the web at the Library, read to a younger child, and more. There will be three raffles for prizes at each Library over the summer and every teen receives a small prize for participating. **No appointment is necessary and all children and teens are invited to participate.**

Summer Reading for kids and teens begins Monday, June 23 and ends Friday, August 8, 2008. Check with your local library for dates and times for special programs and activities. B. Science in the Summer, 2008

Brief Program Description: The Science in the Summer course at the Free Library of Philadelphia this year will be Chemistry, which introduces basic concepts about density, chromatography, acids, bases, gasses, solids, and liquids. Parents must go to the library and fill out an application for the lottery. They will be notified before the program if their child was chosen for the lottery.

V. The Department of Human Services

BEACONS are located in school facilities and open year-round -- provide "safe havens" for the communities' residents (children, youth and adults) through a continuum of after school, youth development and family support activities and services that engage children, while providing supports to their families and other neighborhood residents. The long-term intent of the Beacon is to advance community safety and improve academic, health, and safety outcomes for the children and families. The contracted Beacon providers deliver an array of programming that serves age groups ranging from infants to senior citizens to provide a comprehensive multi-service community center. They are open until 8:30 PM, Monday - Friday.

Summer Camps -- Over 100 summer camp programs will operate from Tuesday, July 1, 2008 through Friday, August 15, 2008. Programs are operated by an array of community-based and faith-based organizations under contract with the City's Out-of-School Time intermediary, Philadelphia Health Management Corporation (PHMC). Programs follow the Core Standards established for after school activities. Each provider sets its calendar of activities and has its own established age groups, but overall, 5- 21 year olds are served. All programs must serve youth for a minimum of six hours per day for students not enrolled in School District mandated summer school and for a minimum of four hours per day for students enrolled in School District summer programming.
